Key responsibility areas

Service delivery

- Research and develop a suite of therapeutic individual, family and/or group
 work interventions that promote strategies which maximise safety and
 wellbeing for children and young people within their families, respects dignity
 and privacy and improves the psychosocial outcomes of the child, young
 person and family.
- Provide coordination and/or facilitation of individual, family or group work in relation the needs of the community, as described by the Wimmera Child and Family Services Alliance Catchment Plan, the Wimmera Early Childhood Development Plan and other relevant data sources.
- Coordination responsibilities include liaison with facilitators and other stakeholders, rotation of sessions internal and external to Uniting Integrated Family Services team and general operations of the groups such as the facility, promotions, demand management, reporting and evaluation.
- Provide project support to the broader Community Capacity team and integrate the needs of clients into other services provided by Uniting Wimmera.
- Assist with preparation of project plans and meet project deliverables relating to concept, budget, scheduling and resources, with the support and direction of the Program Leader Community Capacity
- Participate in relevant service networks and work in partnership with other agencies and funding bodies to continually improve and develop quality services.
- Actively participate in collaborative community education strategies to enhance community understanding of relevant child, youth and family services.

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- Comply within organisational policies and procedures regarding computer and IT restrictions on remote login system.
- Provide case management and case work service to clients in the Integrated Family Services Program when required, using sound judgement, skills and knowledge where procedures are not clearly defined.
- Undertake other duties and functions as directed by Program Leader Community Capacity, commensurate with current level of skills and classification.

Personal accountability

- Compliance with Uniting's values, code of conduct, policies and procedures and relevant government legislation and standards where relevant.
- Cooperate with strategies to actively ensure the safety, protection and wellbeing of children who come into association with us.

- Demonstrated understanding of current trends in legislation and professional practice relevant to the community services sector.
- Demonstrated commitment to professional development, employee orientation and training.
